

PE and Sports Premium Funding

The PE and Sports Premium is designed to help schools improve the quality of the PE and sport activities they offer their pupils.

This funding, provided by the Department for Education, has been allocated to schools for improving their offer and encouraging more children to be regularly active.

Purpose of Funding

Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport. However, schools have been given the freedom to choose how they do this. A list of possible uses has been suggested:

- Hire specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work with teachers during PE lessons;
- Support and involve the least active children by running after-school sports clubs and holiday clubs;
- Provide new facilities, resources and training courses in PE and sport for teachers;
- Run sport competitions or increase pupils' participation in the Schools Games, a national programme that encourages young people to take part in more competitive sport; and
- Run sports activities with other schools.

PRUs receive some of this funding and like schools, must spend it on developing the offer it makes to children and young people who attend the PRU.

Hampden House PRU has decided to use the money to:

- Support and engage the least active children in physical activities by offering a wide and enriching curriculum which includes a variety of adventurous activity in addition to sport and games.
- Increase pupils' participation in the sports and physical activities
- Improve resources to support the development of the subject.

Evaluation and Plan for 2018-19

Sports and PE Premium is allocated based on the number of eligible students on roll at a single point in the preceding academic year, namely the January census. Due to the high turnover of students.

which is an intrinsic part of the work of a Pupil Referral Unit, this is unlikely to reflect the number of eligible students on roll in the course of the following academic year. This is compounded by the fact that many of our students are dual registered, so the PE and Sports Premium will be allocated to their mainstream school rather than Hampden House.

Hampden House received no PE and Sports Premium funding in 2017-18. The key action arising from this is that we plan to ask mainstream schools at which any eligible students are dual-registered for a proportion of this premium, in the same way that we do already for Pupil Premium. There is no obligation for schools to transfer the funds to Hampden House, but our experience is that most do.

Once funding has been secured we plan to use it to support the activities outlined above that were planned for 2017-18, went ahead successfully, and will be repeated in 2018-19. Photographic evidence of the Essex Outdoors residential trip of July 2018 is on display in the main reception area.
